You might say sometimes that your house looks like a disaster area if cleaning has fallen behind, but if you experience an actual disaster, you know the real thing is much worse.

Our county got a taste of a natural disaster this past month, when Tropical Storm Isaías came directly over Easton. Fortunately most of the effects in our immediate area weren't too severe, but there was some flooding (including water in the church basement level), and some downed trees, and power outages in spots. Some areas not too far from here were not as fortunate.

While disasters can strike any time of year, this late summer-early fall period tends to be especially dangerous in the United States, with hurricanes peaking for the Eastern US and sometimes in the Pacific, and wildfires often raging in the West. Tornadoes tend to hit hardest in the spring. And then there are earthquakes, "derecho" storm fronts, ice storms, flash floods, and more, sometimes hitting with little warning.

The Church of the Brethren has acquired a rather sterling reputation in its disaster response, joining a number of other denominations that provide these important services across the US, often partnering with the American Red Cross and various local organizations. Children's Disaster Services teams travel to disaster sites in the immediate wake of disasters to help children cope with the trauma of the experience and care for them while their parents take care of other tasks. Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM) project teams typically go a bit later, traveling to sites to help them with the clean-up and physical rebuilding. And the Emergency Disaster Fund sends relief aid to needs around the world.

In 2019 alone, nearly 1,500 BDM weekly volunteers donated more than 8,600 days of service—a gift valued at about \$1.75 million—while serving 112 families at sites in the US and Puerto Rico. Another \$750,000 in monetary donations and supplies went to overseas projects. More recently, grants have been made to address the disastrous effects of COVID-19.

Consider assisting these ministries if you're able—either through your time at a project site, or through gifts to Brethren Disaster Ministries. Unfortunately, the need is ongoing and seemingly ever more prevalent. One current project is in relatively close in northeastern North Carolina, helping that area with flood recovery efforts. We might hear of needs in our region following Isaías, too.

I'd also note that while hurricanes and major floods and the like get the headlines, there are less visible disasters unfolding around us all the time. A family without enough resources to put food on the table is experiencing a disaster. Someone who has their family members deported is experiencing a disaster. A person who can't pay the hospital bills is experiencing a disaster. Even someone who is just feeling alone and unseen can feel like the world is caving in on them. Disasters can come from the sky, but they can also be economic, physical, and emotional.

So let's do what we can to support the visible needs following natural disasters through the church and other organizations equipped to meet them, but let's also keep our eyes open for the more invisible disasters that might be happening just around the corner, too. We might just help someone weather an unexpected storm.

Talbot Interfaith Shelter


