I've only visited a few haunted houses over the years, but a part of me always wonders, "Why do people DO this?" Why would you pay money to have people do their best to scare the wits out of you? The houses are typically dark and maze-like, full of weird noises and creepy things. Some people even seek out "extreme" haunted houses, where the level of terror is ratcheted up several notches.

Then there are horror movies, which offer another route to your inner fears and darkest nightmares. I once (for some reason) cringed through one with some friends who assured me afterwards, "Oh, that's a mild one." Yet in 2019, such films took in about \$750 million at the US box office.

"Some people just love to be scared," as one article bluntly summarized it.

But while fictional fear-inducing moments might be exciting for a certain group, very few like to live in fear in real life. In this strange year that we've been dealt, though, that seems to be a regular occurrence: a virulent pandemic, lost jobs and shuttered businesses in a turbulent economy, election uncertainty, issues of racial injustice, protests and riots, natural disasters, and—for many of us—significant changes to the routines that usually ground us.

What do we do with all that?

I wish it all were as easy as some Halloween attraction, where we could flip on the lights and laugh. "Look, it was just actors in masks and fake cobwebs and sounds being piped in through an audio system! Nothing to worry about here!" But what we're facing right now is all too real.

Faith does not offer a magic wand that makes everything go away. It is not a panacea. What it does tell us, however, is that we do not face the scary things of life alone. We travel those troubling roads—even the valley of the shadow of death—with God at our side, and with the community of faith surrounding us. That's what a verse of "Will You Let Me Be Your Servant" proclaims: "I will hold the Christ-light for you in the night time of your fear; I will hold my hand out to you, speak the peace you long to hear."

It's natural to feel frightened sometimes. Otherwise we wouldn't hear God reminding people again and again throughout scripture, "Fear not" and "Do not be afraid ... I am with you." Life is scary, some times more than others. But our fears don't have to control us.

While watching a (non-horror!) movie recently, I was struck by words spoken by one of the characters—words originally attributed to John Lennon: "Everything will be okay in the end. If it's not okay, it's not the end." As followers of Christ, those words ring out for us, too. It's hard right now. It's not okay. It's scary. But it's not the end.

I was waiting at the school bus stop for my granddaughters when a neighbor walked up with the cutest puppy. I said to her, "I want your puppy!" She replied, "All the puppies were adopted, but the mother is up for adoption."

I went to the website "Wags and Wishes" of Cambridge. Her name was Sarah. She was the most pitiful-looking dog. I filled out the application and waited.

On June 8, 2016, Sarah was mine. The organization told me she was 3 years old, but she had to have an eye operation, and the doctor said she was 7.

We joined "Pets on Wheels," an organization that allows a person and their pet to visit nursing homes, etc. Every week, once a day,

Sarah and I would visit The Pines and Bayleigh Chase convalescent homes. I would dress Sarah in seasonal costumes that I had made. Sarah would get excited when we visited the dementia unit at The Pines. I don't know why. We also



visited Ellen Walbridge at Dixon House, and the residents there enjoyed seeing her, too. (Because of COVID-19, all the visiting has stopped for now.)

Sarah knows the days; I don't know how, but she does. Tuesdays were our visits to the nursing homes, and Sunday is church. And Sarah has become a real social butterfly due to Sunday church!

On Sunday, Oct. 25, we will mark the 70th anniversary of the first worship service in our building with a brief tribute during our worship time. If you have any historical items that might be displayed that day, please contact the church office.
