Sometimes at youth camp we'll go around a circle as we close a session in prayer and invite everyone to share one thing for which they're thankful. Often they share things like "friends" or campfires" or even "good camp food." Occasionally it's something broader, like "this place where we can all come together" or "my church."

We don't require everyone to share, but I've always been glad that nobody has ever said, "Nothing." I'm sure people have bad days at camp, and I know some of the kids come from challenging homes and backgrounds, but it feels like everyone finds something good to hold on to. I always hope those moments sustain them in some small way after they go back home. And I hope camp creates an environment that helps them look for such moments in everyday life.

Cultivating an ability to find gratitude is an important skill for all of us. As the quote above from 19th century Congregationalist clergyman Henry Ward Beecher reminds us, we often tend to find that which we seek. All these decades later, his words still ring true, especially during a year that has been filled with a cornucopia of challenges.

It can be hard to be thankful in the midst of a pandemic that has upended our lives in many ways and might scramble our holiday plans. It can be hard to be thankful as our country grapples with job losses, racial disparities, political rancor, and natural disasters. It can be hard to be thankful when our denomination is dealing with division in its midst. It can be hard to be thankful as days grow shorter and colder.

While all that swirls around us, I've been so impressed and inspired by our congregation's two oldest members, who have kept their spirits up and their faith strong even in these difficult times. When I saw Ellen Walbridge the other month, after outdoor "porch" visits had become possible, she was radiant, talking about what she's been doing to stay busy and all the people who find ways to stay in touch. And when Doris Schwaninger suffered through back surgery and complications afterward, forcing her to spend two-plus weeks in rehab that spanned her 99th birthday, she reveled in the cake, cards, and calls that came, and said, "Honey, I'm doing the best I can, and that's all any of us can do." She often says, "I'm so blessed it's scary."

Time gives us some perspective, but for these two and others I think it's more than that, too. It's the foundation of faith within us that reminds us, in the words of the old hymn: "Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say, 'It is well, it is well with my soul."

As we celebrate Thanksgiving this month, and in every month, what is it for which YOU are thankful? May your souls experience the true blessings of thanksgiving.

Congratulations Lee!!

Congratulation to Lee Wildasin for being inducted this year to the Easton High School Hall of Fame.

Lee played on one of the most successful girl's basketball teams, that won back-to-back state championships in 1992 and 1993.

"I think my favorite team was our basketball team, not just because we won two state championships, but because we truly came together as a unit." Lee's team was led by Kelley Gibson, a member of 2019 inaugural hall-of-fame class. "Few of us had grown up playing together in youth leagues as we had in field hockey or softball. Our team was unique. We came from different backgrounds, we even had two foreign-exchange students. But we came together as one, both on and off the court, and we had a lot of fun in doing so.

Lee earned All-Mid-Shore honors three times in basketball, and totaled 16 double-doubles in 17 games her senior season.

Lee, a 1995 graduate, also was a field hockey and softball standout.

A two-time captain and four-year starter at catcher, she earned first team All-Mid-Shore honors as a designated hitter her freshman year, then was first-team All-Mid-Shore catcher three consecutive years.

Lee was called up to the varsity team in field hockey late in her freshman year, and developed into a defensive mainstay the following three seasons, when Easton went 36-8-1. She was a two-year captain, who earned All-Mid-Shore honors three times, and was All-Mid-Shore Co-Player of the Year as a senior.

Lee was also a three-time all-state band selection, going on to the University of Maryland, where she was a member of the marching and pep bands as well as the symphonic wind ensemble.

Lee is the daughter of Ed & Liz Wildasin, members of the Easton Church of the Brethren.
