Pastor's Recently I ran across a quote that has been rattling around my brain ever since: "The goal is not to read a book; the goal is to read the story taking place all around us." It was attributed to Thomas Berry and Brian Swimme, two names unfamiliar to me, and appeared without context, so like any good journalist I did a little digging. It turns out that it was written with a scientific lens, calling for a new, deeper understanding of the universe. To get a sense of how the universe works, they say, we must look more intentionally at how all the parts function together, and what role each one plays. That requires eyes and an open mind, not merely a textbook.

While their book, *The Universe Story*, contains some spiritual elements, it is not a distinctly Christian text nor does faith even take center stage. But that quote has continued to resonate with me, causing me to reflect on the way many Christians approach their faith journeys.

For too many of us, the goal becomes merely reading the book—or The Book, in this case: the Bible. Scripture is foundational to who we are and what we do, of course, but learning scripture is not the end goal—living it is. In too many places, people and churches are satisfied with taking some portion of scripture, chewing on it for a bit, and then going on with life rather unchanged. We've done our job! Or, conversely, we bury our noses in the Bible so far that we fail to notice needs on our doorsteps.

Instead, scripture should simply provide the lens for how we engage the world in the rest of life. Our time of worship is not the culmination of our week, but rather the beginning. When we leave the doors of church, we immediately step into the story of our world being written all around us. It's God's story, and it continues.

Our work is to read that story with just as much intensity and passion and meaning, and to figure out our place in it. Then we discern how the words of Jesus and others on those ancient pages need to come alive on the pages being penned each day here and now. Every person we meet is a character in that ongoing manuscript, every place a setting.

So the service and evangelism and outreach and care that we do are not merely things we do because the Bible says we're supposed to, but lines in the next chapter of God's unfolding narrative. We keep reading, and we ourselves enter the story. As poet Walt Whitman wrote: "The powerful play goes on, and we may contribute a verse."

In the midst of this steamy season, then, I invite you to do some summer reading: Dive into the pages of our community and all those you encounter and the world that surrounds them. Savor and digest those words of God, and ponder what chapter might next be written.


