Carrying out the ministry of a church is not always an easy thing. We have a good general sense of what we're to be about as followers of Jesus, but figuring out exactly what that should look like in any given congregation can be challenging—and then actually putting it all into action even more so.



"It takes a village," as the now well-known African proverb says. Or as the apostle Paul tells us in his letters, it takes the whole body of Christ. Each member brings a variety of gifts and abilities to the table. Some have great musical talent. Others are organizers and administrators. Some are builders and fixers. Others are skilled with numbers. Some are teachers. Some excel at hospitality. And so on.

Our congregation isn't huge in numbers, but we do have an abundance of gifts and giving within our faith community. We support activities both within the church and far beyond, from Christian education classes (resuming soon!) to Camp Mardela, from maintaining our facilities to assisting Talbot Interfaith Shelter with their needs, from carrying out love feast and parts of our weekly worship to supporting denominational projects.

It does take the whole body of Christ. And starting in mid-September, we'll begin a special five-part sermon series looking at the ways that each of our Ministry Teams contributes to that work. We'll start with Christian Education and progress through Stewards, Deacons, Witness, and Nurture. Titled "We Are the Church," it hopefully will give you a bit more insight into what these teams do while also lifting up and celebrating their work.

I'd also like to issue a challenge: If you're not currently involved in a ministry of the church in a direct way, consider getting involved and sharing *your* gifts as part of that work. I know committees and meetings aren't for everyone (honestly, they're not my favorite thing, either!), but if being part of a formal Ministry Team or other group isn't your thing, then consider other ways to jump on board.

Could you knit or crochet blankets? Or maybe volunteer regularly at camp or some community organization or send cards? Would you like to provide music or be part of a dramatic presentation? Do you have an idea for some community outreach? Would you love to come in and clean out the church attic or spruce up our garden spaces? Or if there's something we haven't thought of or haven't been doing that you would like to see happen, let us know. Maybe we can get it started.

As Paul says in Romans 12, "God has given us different gifts for doing certain things well. So if God has given you the ability to prophesy, speak out with as much faith as God has given you. If your gift is serving others, serve them well. If you are a teacher, teach well. If your gift is to encourage others, be encouraging. If it is giving, give generously. If God has shown you leadership ability, take the responsibility seriously. And if you have a gift for showing kindness to others, do it gladly" (v. 6-8, NLT).

What's your thing? May you share it gladly, freely, and well.

Christian Formation to Begin


Christian Formation will begin on Sunday, September 12 at 9:30 .m. Worship will begin at 10:45 a.m.

There will be two classes forming in the Fall.



News from the District Office



A letter from the District Conference Moderator

Your Program & Arrangements (P&A) Committee has been working to finalize plans for our District Conference in October. When we last communicated, it was looking very optimistic for us to meet in October without concern. However, in recent weeks we're hearing of a new Delta variant of the Coronavirus that is spreading steadily in the U.S. and other places around the world.

P&A consulted with Dr. Kathryn "Kate" Jacobsen, PhD, MPH, Professor of Epidemiology and a member of the Oakton Congregation. These discussions and recent developments have brought us to the conclusion that the 2021 District Conference be held virtually, out of an abundance of caution and genuine concern for others. As we prepare this letter, the majority of counties in the MAD have a High (Red) level of Community Transmission with the remaining being Substantial (Orange). You can view this at https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view.

District Conference will still be held on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 9</u>. We will meet via a <u>Zoom link</u> from <u>10:00 a.m. – 12:00 Noon</u>. We are condensing the agenda to include a worship time, several District reports and a few other reports. Jo Ann Landon has been gathering materials for the Conference booklet. These will be distributed electronically late in the month of September. Hard copy booklets will be available at a cost of \$5.

We will conduct a "dry run" Zoom call on Monday, September 27 at 7:00 p.m. for anyone that wants to test their technical equipment. This will be a brief 30-minute opportunity for Conference attendees to make sure they have the necessary equipment and connections for accessing the Zoom link. Participation in this "dry run" call is optional and offered simply for anyone that would like to practice their connectivity. Separate Zoom links will be distributed for both the dry run and the Conference. Dialing in by phone will also be an option.

Delegate registration materials will be distributed soon. We are requesting a Delegate registration fee of \$10 for Delegates. The Zoom platform will allow questions to be submitted in the Chat box. We will prepare a hard copy ballot for voting on the budget and slate/ballot, similar to how we handled those last year. The budget and slate will be presented during the Conference and delegates will vote and mail their ballot to the District office.

Thank you to each of you that have been praying for us as we have worked through this pandemic to prepare for District Conference the past two years. Thank you as well to those that have worked on arrangements for an inperson Conference – both in 2020 and 2021.




Camp Mardela News from Jen Summy:




Save the Pate!

Please save the date for October 28 at the Avalon Theatre.


The Avalon will be hosting Paul Young, author of "The Shack" - the #1 New York Times Bestseller that was also adapted into the film starring Octavia Spencer.
