Somehow the Christmas season seems to have snuck up even more quickly than usual this year. It feels like it was just 80 degrees, and now we're watching TV specials filled with swirling snow while the last leaves drop from the trees outside. I was surprised the other week—still well before Thanksgiving—to be scanning through the stations on the radio and having Christmas music pop up on several of them.



While I usually make myself wait until after Thanksgiving to start listening to Christmas music (constantly!), I let it ride for a while this year. It's been a challenging couple of years, and some Christmas-y tunes felt like good comfort food for the soul. Many of the seasonal radio songs are secular ones, of course, highlighting snowmen and reindeer and grinches and wintry scenes, but a surprising number of sacred ones are woven in, too. And I love them both.

For many people, I think, the music of Advent and Christmas might be one of the most anticipated things as the calendar moves toward December. There's something about those tunes, those words, those rhythms that bring back wonderful memories of the past while also drawing us anew into the miracle of the present.

It's hard for me to think of a Christmas Eve service without hearing "Silent Night," or of going through Christmas week without the peals of "Joy to the World" or the soulful strains of "O Holy Night." As French author/poet Alphonse de Lamartine once said, "Music is the literature of the heart; it commences where speech ends."

They also provide a cadence to the season, moving us from the early stirrings of hope in Advent toward the crescendo of Christmas. One of my former pastors always made a point of not actually singing Christmas songs in worship until Christmas Eve as a reminder that Advent is a season of building up and expectation. I often cheat on that, as I love too many Christmas hymns to wait for them all, but I do like to work them in slowly. Anticipation is good for the soul!

In the three sermons I'll be sharing during December, I'm going to draw on a few of those favorite Christmas songs—both secular and sacred—as jumping-off points to help us more deeply explore this time of the church calendar that's so central to who we are as Christians. We'll sing the songs, but we'll also ponder (to use a good Advent word) what they and others mean for us as people of faith. Where do find wonder? What do we do about it? Who is it that we really seek to follow?

I invite you to think about your favorite Advent/Christmas songs and why they're meaningful to you, too. If you'd like, write down a paragraph about one of yours and send it to me or the church office, and I'll try to share some of those during the coming month. And as you sing the songs of the season in the weeks ahead I encourage you to think intentionally about the words and what they say to you.

"There's a song in the air!" as one carol says. May those melodies warm your ears and your souls as we journey toward Christmas once again.




News from the Talbot Interfaith Shelter
