Dear Members of Mid-Atlantic District,

I am writing to tell you that at their meeting on June 19, 2022, the district leadership team has accepted my notice of retirement effective November 30, 2022, with my active service concluding on July 15, 2022. Interim plans are being worked on by Church of the Brethren Director of Ministry Nancy Sollenberger Heishman and district leaders and will be announced upon finalization. In the meantime, please continue to be in touch with me and district administrative assistant Jo Ann Landon as you have need.

It has been a privilege to stand on the shoulders of the dedicated and effective executives who have preceded me and to serve the Mid-Atlantic district as executive minister over the past thirteen years. It's been humbling and inspiring to have experienced the Christian faith, commitment, and partnership of so many leadership team members, the chairpersons, district moderators, ministry team and task team members with whom I've related. I'm thankful for those of you who have led and supported our district disaster auction and meat canning project, which have brought us together and extended our care in Jesus' name far beyond our district boundaries. Relationships with leaders and members across our fifty-nine congregations have blessed me. Having facilitated sixty-some pastoral placements during my tenure, including some multiple congregational placements, not including interim placements, I'm thankful for so many gifted and committed Mid-Atlantic pastors and am gratified that Mid-Atlantic has been able to attract quality leaders. Our pastors and their time are primary assets and should be highly valued. Dedicated administrative assistants, a manager of district operations, and a few special advisors have helped shoulder the burdens and lighten the load over the years. Mid-Atlantic has maintained the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace during a fracturing time in our denominational and national lives, and I am incredibly proud of your spiritual maturity and witness to Jesus' power to bridge divisions and to bind us together. I'm thankful for your trust, support, and encouragement over these years, and for making me and my ministry a part of your prayers. Among much shared ministry we've made the effort of a church restart in Dundalk-GraceWay; converted the closing and sale of Good Shepherd into building a district endowment for the future and resourcing church revitalization and replanting, along with providing operational funds; and seen each other to a new normal with COVID while looking "not only to our own interests, but also to the interests of others" (Ph 2:4).

Reynolds Price wrote an inspiring autobiography, A Whole New Life. After forty-plus years of Church of the Brethren ministerial service I am looking forward to a whole new life. I also look forward with you to what will be the next chapter in Mid-Atlantic's mission and ministry. The extended connections and support a district provides are invaluable, and more than ever in this particular time. I encourage you to stay connected to Jesus and to stick with each other, and to continue to focus on our district mission of encouraging spiritual formation, healthy congregations, and evangelism and church extension. I pray God's blessings for our district leadership, district pastors and district congregations as you continue to seek God's blessings and direction and continue the work of Jesus.
