Some sources say that Advent began on November 11 (St. Martins Day) at some time in the 5th century in the form of a six week fast leading to Christmas. Advent was shortened at some stage in the sixth century, and the fasting was later no longer observed. Advent is a time to reflect and prepare for Christmas, similarly to how Lent is in preparation for Easter. Purple is historically the color of Advent because it reflects fasting and it's the color of royalty, to welcome the new born King, Jesus. It also celebrates the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his second Advent.

Christmas truly is one of the most wonderful times of the year. For many of us there are Christmas parties, decorating our cozy homes, sharing gifts and sending Christmas greetings. Unfortunately, we sometimes get lost in the season and forget the real reason for celebrating Christmas. However, that's usually the extent of their knowledge or perhaps they have lost sight of this in their busyness in preparing for Christmas. So...why do we truly celebrate Christmas traditions? 
