February...a Time of Love and the Beginning of Lent...a time of Repentance and Reflection

Usually, when we think of the month of February, we automatically think of Valentine's Day. It is a day that we show gratitude to that special person or persons we hold dear...the one(s) we LOVE! Even now, the stores have on display Valentine cards, chocolates and candy hearts, and lovely bouquets of flowers to give to that special sweet heart.

However, did you know February comes from the Latin word februa, which means "to cleanse". The month was named after the Roman Februalia, which was a month long festival of purification and atonement that took place this time of year.

So, it seems quite appropriate that Lent begins on the 22nd of February this year, beginning with Ash Wednesday. Between Ash Wednesday and Easter, many Christians observe a 40 day period know as Lent. Lent is meant to be a period of repentance and an awareness that sin separates us from God.

Prayer, fasting, almsgiving and reflection are considered to be the pillars of Lent. Traditionally, Christians have used the time period to prepare themselves spiritually for the drama of Holy Week and the celebration of the resurrection.

It has been said that Lent is the most "Brethren" of all the liturgical seasons. Lent invites us to both inward piety and outward practice. And, of course, Lent includes the Brethren "high holy day" of Maundy Thursday, when we gather as Jesus did with His disciples to wash one another's feet, share a meal together and partake of the bread and cup of Holy Communion: all ways we remind ourselves of the kind of people we are called by God to be.




Who: North Meets South Duo What: "From Spain to Spirituals"

Toronto-born guitarist Danielle Cumming, and American tenor John Wesley Wright from Rome, Georgia, North Meets South, joined forces in 2007 when they met as colleagues at Salisbury University, and have now performed together for over a decade. While their repertoire tanges from the Renaissance to modern popular music, it is African American spirituals that hold a central place in their performances and educational outreach programs. The Duo has performed for descendants of Frederick Douglass as part of the "Frederick Douglass: Talbot County's Native Son and International Hero, Bicentennial Prayer Breakfast" in Easton; at the Roland Hayes Museum's Harris Arts Center in Calhoun, Georgia, a concert hall honoring the eatly 20th century lyric tenor; and most recently at the National Polk Festival hosted in Salisbury, Maryland. Lunch will be served at 12:00 noon Concert will begin at 12:30 p.m. Advance registration is required for lunch by February 2nd or you may bring your own.



Empty Bowls of Talbot County is holding its annual Empty Bowls dinner February 25, 2023. I am hoping you will help spread the word about our upcoming in-person soup dinner to your congregation. Empty Bowls' mission is to eliminate food insecurity one bowl at a time by raising funds to donate to local food pantries. The soup dinner on February 25 is our biggest fundraiser of the year and we hope to raise \$10,000 for local food banks.

Below is information to share with your community:

What is Empty Bowls and its Annual Soup Dinner?

The Empty Bowls dinner on February 25th at St. Mark's United Methodist Church in Easton is an opportunity for those of us who eat without worry to reach out to our neighbors for whom a meal may be a luxury. Every penny raised from ticket sales for the event is given to Talbot County food pantries to help keep their shelves stocked.

How does Empty Bowls work? When you come to the dinner, you will be provided with a meal of hot soup donated by local chefs in bowls created by members of the community. The hand painted bowl is yours to take home.

How can you help Empty Bowls end food insecurity in Talbot County?

- Purchase a ticket and attend the dinner on February 25: Advanced ticket purchase
 required. Tickets go on sale January 9th. Purchase early as the event sells out.
- Hand paint a bowl: Go to Kiln Born at 1 S. Washington Street, Easton between January
