As I write this newsletter article, we haven't had much, if any measurable rain for at least a couple of weeks. The last rain I remember people talking about was the 5 inches people near Easton and even into St. Michaels received. In Cordova, we barely saw any rain that day. Since it is so dry, farm fires have erupted making some farm equipment inoperable, since farmers have been harvesting winter wheat. Dry conditions have created a sense of worry for all involved in the current harvest. People have been asking for prayers on Facebook. The seeds being planted following this harvest will likely not germinate without rain, which could affect the next crop of soybeans. Seeds require rain and soil, and fertilizer to grow. When we are dependent on God's provision, in this case rain, we can begin losing faith, that all will be lost, and no recovery will happen. What then is our response? Hope. Hope is a word and experience which shows up throughout the Old and New Testaments. The scripture that caught my attention was Psalm 33: 18-22. It prompts us to be aware of God's eye being upon us, hoping in steadfast love, deliverance, and staying alive. These words speak of our souls waiting, but knowing God is our help and shield. Our hearts are glad, we trust, and know God's steadfast love is with us even as we hope in God.

A song of hope that comes to mind is "My Life is In You." It has a line in it that speaks these words "My hope is in you, Lord...." It is not a dirge of a song, but one with time and beat that causes us to clap and smile as we sing it together with our siblings in Christ. Hoping in the midst of fear is not always easy. To hope when drought seems to be unending, calls us to trust even when our anxiety wants to shut us down. I pray we keep our heads up, our hearts trusting God even when apprehension slinks in. Hope can surprise us and empower us to keep going. "My hope is in you, Lord, in you, its in you." Our hope is in you, O God.




