Do you ever struggle with decision-making, articulating your perspective, or getting along in a group or even in your family? Can I raise my hands twice for each one? In the scriptures, we can find people who choose to not share their thoughts with others. Some may lack the ability to be honest or just cannot get along. We find families unable to talk through their jealousy like with David and his brothers. The siblings decided to ship David off rather than have a conversation as a family. Their father needed to be included because they were angry with him, but they decided to act on the situation themselves without him. In the New Testament letters, Paul is concerned about people within congregations getting along. And sometimes he wasn't just worried about them getting along, but how worldly influences interfered with their ability to get along. Sound familiar?

Trying new ways of communicating can be challenging, but ultimately can bring people closer together. Often when we do not work through our conflict and choose to cut people off, the results can be devastating to families, churches, and organizations. Since I am relationship oriented, I am always looking for new ways of understanding people or communicating better.

Recently, I was introduced to a way of thinking called the "Six Thinking Hats" by Edward DeBono. It is not a new book, but an interesting process. De Bono says, "It is an alternative to the argument system, which has never intended to be constructive or creative. With the Six Hats method the emphasis is on "What can be" rather than just on "What is," and on how we design a way forward- not on who is right and who is wrong." The hats are as follows:

White Hat: Neutral and objective, concerned with facts and figures

Red Hat: The emotional view

Black Hat: Careful and Cautious, the "devil's advocate" hat

Yellow Hat: Sunny and Positive

Green Hat: Associated with fertile growth, creativity, and new ideas

Blue Hat: cool, the color of the sky, above everything else-the organizing hat

The Six Hats is not something we can learn overnight, but might be helpful to work at. Businesses who have used this model spend less time in meetings and make decisions quicker than they have previously. Wouldn't we love that, church?! LOL How we think matters. DeBono says, "Confusion is the biggest enemy of good thinking." With the Six Hats method, the group tries to do only one thing at a time. I have heard of a church who used this method with success for a recent decision-making process. I wonder if all churches used a more neutral and objective way of exploring possibilities, what might happen? Maybe it could lead to projects being completed, creativity soaring, and as a result a renewed sense of hope. I wonder what Jesus would think? Something to ponder and pray about.

We Americans have a passion to possess gans despite the terrible misuse of them. We talk about the "right" to perpetuate weapons of destruction as a part of our basic freedoms. One wonders whether we can long survive unless we come to realize that in our complex and troubled age guns are not an evidence of freedom but of a primitiveness which spells the breakdown of orderly, rational society. Guns were never a worthy means of settling differences. In our society, where we are pressed closely together, they become intolerable. We need to begin to think about the kind of gun control which other civilized nations. long ago enacted . . . .

Some observers suggest that we should look toward a day when we would turn in all our guns as a number of nations have done. They suggest that we need some other kind of "sport" for inculto play at, in modern terms the dream of the Old Testament prophet, Isalah, of a day when men would beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks would surely be in terms of melting down guns into instruments of healing and well-being.
