He is working on his Doctorate of Ministry in Spiritual Direction and Spiritual Formation, from Fuller Theological Seminary. We learned about Silence/Centering Prayer on August 25. Sept. 1 we will worship together at Camp Mardela, however here are our "Prayerful Pauses" topics:

Breath Prayer - to pray without ceasing

Lectio Divina - prayer that is done with scripture

Examen/Confession - paying attention in honesty before God

Raising Voices - not a silent prayer, but one being open and outward in speaking our prayers aloud.

Intercessory Prayer - in worship is a way to communally join God with others by bringing the desires on behalf of others to Christ.

We hope that by participating in this each week, we will learn something new about prayer.

As camp grows and impacts the lives of more people, we want to ensure that Camp Mardela not only survives, but thrives, and your generous financial gifts will help us do just that. Thank you for your consideration in supporting Camp Mardela.

<u>Summer Updates:</u> Almost every year since 2021, we have seen our camp programs growing. We had about a 10% increase from last year. Our goal was 25%, but we are still very pleased that we saw growth. We had 2 winter retreat camps and for the first time we were able to use Krabill Hall for these camps with the newly-installed heat and air conditioning system! The air conditioning was also a BIG help in the record-breaking heat of this summer. We are very excited about the program possibilities we now have now that this building can be used year-round. We were able to give about \$5,000 in scholarships to campers who needed financial assistance. This program is a big part of our outreach to ensure that all campers who want to come to camp can, and that money is not an obstacle for them to experience God at camp. We had a FULL staff for the first time post-pandemic, and this support was instrumental in the summer programs going as smoothly as they did. Camp this summer was more expensive than previous years, though, and we are seeking financial donations. This financial support helps to ensure that we have what is needed to run programs as prices of goods and services continue to increase, and this support helps us keep the cost of camp affordable in the midst of this.

Family Camp: Family Camp is coming up very quickly!! We are holding it on Labor Day weekend - August 30th-September 1st. We have so many exciting things planned, too. Barbara Wise Lewczak will share her wisdom on worship with us for the weekend. There will also be campfires, games, boating, fishing, archery, swimming, and of course - time to spend with your family and friends. The significance of Patriot Day

Three months after the 2001 terrorist attacks, Congress approved a joint resolution designating September 11 as Patriot Day. Every year, we pause to remember the lives lost and changed on that autumn morning.

The resolution requests that each year the president issue a proclamation calling on the American people and state and local governments to observe the day with appropriate activities. Those include remembrance services, candle-light vigils, moments of silence and flying the U.S. flag at half-staff.

In his 2023 proclamation President Biden said, "Together, may we continue to demonstrate that the rights and freedoms that those terrorists sought to destroy on September 11, 2001, remain unwavering — strengthened by genera-

tions of Americans who have dared all and risked all to defend, protect and preserve our democracy."

PEACING IT TOGETHER A living peace church

There will be a special peace service during the Sunday morning worship September 22 to extend recognition of the International Day of Prayer for Peace celebrating on September 21.

Public Life

The UN's International Day of Peace is a global observance and not a public holiday. It is a day when nations around the world are invited to honor a cessation hostilities during the day.

Background

A UN resolution established the International Day of Peace in 1981 to coincide with the opening of the UN General Assembly. The first Peace Day was celebrated in 1982 and was held on the third Tuesday of September each year until 2002, when September 21 became the permanent date for the International Day of Peace. The assembly decided in 2001 that the International Day of Peace should be annually observed on September 21 starting in 2002. By setting a fixed date for the International Day of Peace, the assembly declared that the day should be observed as a day of global ceasefire and non-violence.

By creating the International Day of Peace, the UN devoted itself to worldwide peace and encouraged people to work in cooperation for this goal. Since its inception, Peace Day has marked personal and planetary progress toward peace. It has grown to include millions of people worldwide and many events are organized each year to commemorate and celebrate this day.

Symbols

The peace dove flying with an olive branch in its beak is one of the most commonly fea-

tured symbols for the day. In Judaism, Christianity, and Islam a white dove is generally a sign of peace. The dove can also represent "hope for peace" or a peace offering from one person to another, hence the phrase "to extend an olive branch". Often, the dove is represented as still in flight to remind people of its role as messenger.




