#### Pentecost is Coming!

In the book of Acts, specifically Acts 2: 1-4 we read "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." I love this scripture and the imagery of divided tongues that appeared like fire among them. Children's Bibles, which have illustrations along with a brief description of this story from Acts 2, often depict the scene with different people gathered together with little tongues of fire resting on their heads. I am curious about the emotions, thoughts, overall experience of the day, and what it meant to the people.

Some might ask, does Pentecost still exist in today's church? Sometimes I wonder if Pentecost should or could be an every Sunday occurrence. I don't know about you, but I have been in worshipful experiences over my lifetime, where the Holy Spirit showed up in a big way and other times slipped in quietly when either alone or with other people. Whether in worship or prayer, through the spoken word or even in silence the Holy Spirit can "speak" to us. Does the Spirit appear to you in a big way like the roar of a fire or in the small, quiet flame of a candle?


June 8 is Pentecost Sunday. How will we celebrate it? I imagine like we always do with singing, prayer, as well as adding communion to our worshipful time together. Will we lift our voices to sing "Holy Spirit, Come with Power" with a different attitude, deep feeling or gusto? I would expect when Anne Rupp wrote the words for this hymn, she expected us to sing with energy, "Holy Spirit Come with power, breathe into our aching night. We expect you this glad hour, waiting for your strength and light." Can we sing with a renewed openness to what God is doing within the Easton Church of the Brethren, our faith community that shares the love and blessing of God with all?

Camp Mardela's theme for camp this year is "Got Spirit?" The campers will be exploring how the Holy Spirit manifests itself in wonder, gratitude, hospitality, generosity, worship, and love. How might we explore the Holy Spirit this summer through these same daily themes? Could we begin by reading the book of Acts with new eyes? In "A Dunker Guide to the Bible," I read the chapter on Acts authored by Tara Hornbacker, where she writes, "As we read Acts in community with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, may we find inspiration to be the surrendered, transformed, and empowered church for the future." With God's help through the leading of the Holy Spirit, may it be so!

#### PEACING IT TOGETHER

### Which Jesus do you want?

Matthew 27: 15-23

"Whom do you want me to release for you, Jesus Barabbas or Jesus who is called the Messiah?" (v.17)

PILATE PRESENTED TWO prisoners to the crowd, offering to release the one they chose: Jesus Barabbas or Jesus Messiah. The crowd's choice might be the most revealing moment of the entire Holy Week story.

I used to picture Barabbas as a common criminal—a bad guy, to be sure, but not all that different from anyone you might visit at the local jail. Bible translators have often described him as a thief, someone who violated the rights of others in his community and was paying his debt to society.

The problem with these interpretations is that the Roman government didn't crucify common criminals; crucifixion was reserved for political revolutionaries. Luke 23: 18 confirms Barabbas had been arrested for insurrection. Why, then, was the crowd so eager for Pilate to release Barabbas?

Perhaps because they hated that the land God had given them was occupied by the Roman government who, among other things, taxed them for the services they provided. Barabbas offered freedom and the crowd's enthusiastic response to his potential release suggests they viewed him as a hero. Seen this way, Barabbas is more like George Washington, or even Luke Skywalker from the Star Wars movies—someone who will bring salvation through military rebellion.

Jesus the Messiah also offers to restore God's kingdom. In his vision, the meek and the peacemakers will be blessed, swords will become plowshares, and the poor will find justice.

Which Jesus do we trust with our lives? The choice is never as easy as we imagine.+

Jesus, the temptation of violence and domination is never far from me. Forgive me for the times I've chosen Barabbas instead of you.
